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Reading Record and Home Learning Book

These Widmer End spiral bound books will be used to record daily home learning tasks, in particular the reading that your child does at home. The Home Learning Book (purple book) will be checked every week on a Monday. Any communication regarding your child should be emailed via the office with the subject FAO Miss Davis. Reading records will be sent home after Meet the Teacher on Tuesday 10th September and the first Home Learning will be set the week beginning 16th September.

When you receive your child's Reading Record please sign the home school agreement as soon as possible.

Reading

Year 1 children are required to read **at least 3 times a week for 10-15 minutes**, to an adult, as part of their home learning, allowing time for discussion, questions and answers. Your child will bring home a phonics book, a library book and a sharing book each week. The phonics book will match your child's phonics ability. While reading this book your child should be encouraged to FRED talk words that they are unsure of. The library book is a book to be enjoyed together. The sharing book is to be shared with an adult as it will be more challenging for your child. Please record the date and the time spent reading in their **Reading Record**. We will check that this has been completed each Monday.

Additional Homework

Home learning is key to their progress, as it reinforces what we are teaching in class. Every week a phonics or spelling task will be sent out via EdShed (login details will be stuck in the Reading Record). Word building and practising FRED talk to spell words is key to your child's development in reading and writing. In addition to this, a Maths or English task will be set each week in their **Home Learning Books**. A **minimum of 20 minutes** should be spent on these additional tasks. The EdShed task will be set on a Monday with 1 week to complete. The Maths or English task will be set on a **Tuesday** and handed in the following **Monday**.

Any Home Learning that is not completed and handed in will result in your child being sent to Study Squad on a Thursday lunchtime to complete the missing work.

PE days

On the days that your child has PE, they will need to come to school wearing their kit for the whole day.

Children will need to come to school in their PE kit on a **Wednesday**. PE kit consists of:

- Black shorts, skort, jogging bottoms or leggings (with or without school logo*)
- White T-shirt (with or without school logo)
- Royal Blue PE Hoodie (with W.E. logo)
- Sports socks
- Black or white trainers



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Forest School

During the Autumn Term, Year 1 will be taking part in Forest School **every Tuesday starting on 10th September**. Your child will need to come into school wearing suitable clothing which consists of:

- Waterproofs – trousers and jacket
- Black tracksuit bottoms
- PE top
- One thick jumper
- One fleecy zip up jacket (just in case)
- Two pairs of socks. On the bottom, one thin cotton sock, and the top, a thick wool or fluffy bed sock
- Wellies or sturdy closed toe shoes (which you don't mind getting wet and muddy!) If they are laced, you **MUST** be able to do them yourself!
- Waterproof gloves

When the weather starts to turn colder after half term these extra clothing items are advised:

- Base layer - thermals
- Neck scarf
- Hat and gloves – waterproof, ski gloves are great!
- Four pairs of socks. Two pairs to wear (on the bottom, one thin cotton sock, and the top, a thick wool or fluffy bed sock) and two spare pairs
- Extra Jumpers to be packed in a backpack for really cold days!
- Snow boots or sturdy warm outdoor boots which are waterproof/ If they are laced, you **MUST** be able to do them yourself!

- School starts at the **time of 8:45am** with the bell ringing at **8:43am** and finishes at **3:15pm**
- Please inform the school office by **9.30 am** if your child is not going to be in school that day.

- Art Overall
- A4 Popper/Zip Wallet

We have a stationery shop on ParentPay where you can purchase additional and replacement equipment, or your child can bring in cash to spend in school.
