? What are we learning about video editing?

We watch videos everywhere; at the cinema, on Netflix, Youtube and also on the iLearn2 website. These videos and movies have all been created using video editing software and it is one of the most common tasks that people use computers for. Videos are edited to make sure they look and sound the best they can. This includes merging together video clips that have been recorded separately, such as filming a scene from different angles. There are also many tools (see the vocabulary below) that help us adjust the video.

Key knowledge

- 1. Add scenes to a video timeline.
- 2. Add scripted voiceover audio, adjust the volume and crop clips (including splitting a clip).
- 3. Add more clips and use transition effects.
- 4. Add titles.
- 5. Use elements such as shapes.
- 6. Add music background music and adjust the volume.
- 7. Export a project.



B Important Vocabulary

Clips	Small parts of a video or pictures that make up one overall video.
Timelines	The timeline is where we place the clips in an order to make a whole video.
% Split	We can split a clip into smaller parts, such as removing the middle of a clip.
Transitions	Add different effects that go between the clips, such as swiping across or spinning
AB Titles	Add text to the clips, such as giving more information. You can choose the position, size and colour of the text.
Voiceovers Voiceovers	Record a VoiceOver that speaks over the top of the clips, such as in advert or documentary film.
Export	Save your video to your computer to use with software or send somewhere else.
