Laura D: depends on patterns or if it is just adhoc - would be good to get a bigger picture and make families understand how it impacts the data/ that schools have to uphold requirements set by law & government Alison: Asked what the guidelines from government are if the child is sick/ continual sick? GH replied as sickness/ diarrhoea is off for 48hrs. Nothing else. VM talked about educating the children to not spread germs (eg practise handwashing in assembly) Katie: What about attendance certificates for 100%? Or a sticker. General feeling is that it isn't fair as the children cannot help being sick. Liz: Assembly talk anout if the children are having problems getting in Alison: do you record if they are late? KA - we have a robust attendance policy and procedures to follow. We will support families for ongoing issues.
