Reading Recharged planning	<p>Al Barton (Author of Reading Recharged and a practising teacher) has been updating his Dropbox with a WCR lesson based on books released in 2021. The lessons are similar to our sequence but not exactly the same so you cannot just use the lessons as they are, but the extracts for the texts are there as well as questions and vocabulary that you can use as a starting point for your lessons using the texts he uses. There are both fiction and non-fiction in his folders, all separated into year groups.
