### MONITORING THE QUALITY OF EDUCATION

One of the key functions of the governing board is to hold the head teacher and senior leaders to account for the educational performance of the school. We were very pleased to welcome Miss Addison, the Phonics lead, to our meeting in November to hear about how the children are taught and supported to develop this fundamental skill. We asked Miss Addison a range of questions to help us understand how the teaching of Phonics progresses through the school and heard about recent changes to the timetable to improve the efficacy of lessons. We will be reviewing data throughout the year to monitor the impact of these actions.



#### SCHOOL TOUR AND FINANCE MATTERS

Governors were delighted to be able to have a full tour of the school following our first meeting of the academic year in September, when we were shown round in groups by Mrs Hillier and Mrs Marshall. This enabled us to see the school in action for the first time since March 2020 and talk to some of the children as well as staff.

We have also been scrutinising the school budget in light of the sharp rise in energy costs and other essential expenditure which has been hitting everyone this year. Thanks to the hard work of Mrs Hillier and Miss Bailey, our Bursar, we are cautiously optimistic that the school is well-placed to weather the storm. We will continue to monitor robustly.

# **SAFEGUARDING**

At the start of each academic year, governors must read government guidance about procedures for protecting children in schools. Our safeguarding governor, Helen Carmody, also visits the school every term to review safeguarding procedures. Parents may have noticed the enhancements to signing-in processes and information provided for visitors, as well as improvements to the security of the building, all of which have been recorded in Helen's reports.
