LISTENING TO FEEDBACK

Thank you to the 97 parents who completed the survey at this term's Parents' Evenings. At our meeting at the beginning of December, governors reviewed all the responses and monitored for any emerging trends. It was good to note that the overwhelming majority of parents say their children are happy at the school and that they would recommend Widmer End to others.



We also reviewed the findings from a pupil survey, taken just after half term. Again, the majority of feedback was very positive. Governors discussed with Mrs Marshall and Mrs Ross-Wood how any concerns that were identified were being addressed.

ENSURING RESOURCES FOR ALL TO REACH THEIR POTENTIAL

The latest Pupil Premium statement has recently been published on the school's website. This document describes how the school uses the very valuable funding it receives from the government to support children from lower income families and those in receipt of certain benefits to ensure that they are not disadvantaged in comparison to their peers. The Pupil Premium governor met recently with Mrs Ross-Wood, the Pupil Premium lead, to discuss how the school decides how to use this money and how it knows that the money is being well spent.

If you think there's a chance you may be eligible for Pupil Premium, please do ask the School Office for further details and an application form. This additional funding could make a big difference to your child's education.

PLANS FOR EXPANDING OUR EARLY YEARS PROVISION

We are very lucky at Widmer End to have a thriving pre-school. As well as giving our youngest pupils a fabulous start to their education, the pre-school acts as an important pipeline for our Reception intake each year. At our December meeting, governors agreed to progress with a plan to expand the pre-school provision to include children aged 0-2 years which will provide an important service to the local community as well as give an additional boost to the numbers of children joining Widmer End. The school is currently applying for grants to fund the changes to the current buildings to enable this important project to go ahead.
