What the pupils and students say:

It has taught me certain words to use to explain how I feel and what I am thinking.

What the parents say:

What the staff say:

Values education opens up a pathway to further discussion and provides a means for children to talk in depth about feelings and the world they live in.

It gives a consistent approach to moral education. It creates a team spirit and is successful because of this.

Why are we using Values based Education in our school?

We want to create the climate for a happy and successful school. We believe that positive values should underpin our curriculum and all of school life.

What are values?

Values are the principles that guide our thinking and behaviour. We have six core values: Unity, Trust, Courage, Curiosity, Happiness and Respect. These values were chosen by the School Council and discussed at a Parent workshop.



How do they guide school life? They are:

- ★ A framework for developing positive attitudes to learning and achieving high outcomes.
- * A process for nurturing well being.
- **★** A focus for promoting good citizenship.

How does this approach work?

- ★ Together, staff and learners establish core values.
- **★** The values are woven into assemblies and the curriculum.
- **★** Everyone discusses and works to enact these values.

What will I notice?

Many parents notice the school develops:

- **★** A calm and productive atmosphere
- **★** Improved behaviour
- **★** Improved relationships

Many parents notice that over time their children become:

- ★ Better able to concentrate
- ★ More positive about learning
- ★ More confident and willing to challenge themselves
