Key Achievements	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need
- Successfully moved to Cedar Park swimming pool for swimming lessons, saving money on coaches to and from Wycombe Leisure Centre. - Feedback on instructors and general swimming experience is much more positive and every week is having a positive effect on the children's abilities. - We have seen a very positive impact in the Y6 swimming data and children are enjoying the lessons. - The school continues to offer a wide range of sports clubs, both paid and voluntary run. Pupils are encouraged to take part in extracurricular activities such as running club, dance, football, netball and gymnastics. Other clubs involving physical activity are run, such as gardening - this offers outdoor activities for those who are not as keen on conventional sports. - HG Sports partnership school competitions were successfully run, giving the children the opportunity to compete locally. KS2 children are walking to these events, to promote active and healthy lifestyles. - Second year of contract with club provider First Touch Sports. We are happy with the impact on lunchtimes and CPD within PE lessons for teachers. The after school football club is very popular and feedback is positive. - New play equipment has been purchased by the PTA, to allow children to have access to a wide range of equipment during break and lunch times. Timetables allow children to have access to all of the new equipment across the week of playtimes. - Table tennis allows an extra area of the playground to be used in break and lunch times. This area was not previously used for any purpose and was an empty space. - From pupil voice, 100% of pupils are very positive about PE and feel it has a high profile within the school. - The Widmer End U11's football team won the district league, following coaching from parents and time put into extra practice sessions. The netball team has also won several tournaments and these achievements are all celebrated in assemblies with trophies and medals.	- To provide a wider range of sports that are not within the PE curriculum to ensure we are providing clubs for different interests e.g. fencing through taster days, to raise the profile of PE and ensure we are offering something for everyone. - To ensure teachers are confident with how to provide challenges and adaptations to PE lessons. Children need to be aware of how to challenge themselves or adapt skills to ensure they are accessible to all. - To promote active and healthy living through the use of active learning across the curriculum, not just in PE. This in turn, will then continue to improve the profile of PE and active lives across the school. - Ensure we have a clear plan of priorities for next year, following the recent statement regarding the decrease in Sports Premium funding in the academic year of 2026/2027.
